# Remember!

## **Past Simple:**

- 1. reiškia veiksmą, vykusį ir pasibaigusį iki kalbamojo momento. Konkretus praeities laikotarpis nurodomas laiko aplinkybėmis, pvz.: yesterday, last (Tuesday, week...), (a month) ago, in 2015, in June, at two o'clock;
- **2.** reiškia kelių veiksmų seką praeityje, pvz.: Helen **came** into the room, **turned on** the TV and **sat down** on the sofa.

**Taisyklingųjų** veiksmažodžių (**regular verbs**) visų asmenų būtasis laikas sudaromas prie bendraties pridedant **-ed**, pvz.: work – worked, bet dance – danced, carry – carried, clap – clapped.
